In addition to his role in teaching the shoulder and elbow fellow in weekly conferences and in the operating room, Dr. Lin is the Associate Program Director for the UPMC Sports Medicine Fellowship and is Co-Director of the Pittsburgh Shoulder Institute. He is also a member of the AAOS Appropriate Use Criteria Committee for rotator cuff tears and the American Orthopaedic Association (AOA) Fellowship Education Coalition Committee. He is a rising star in the world of shoulder surgery and has authored many important papers on shoulder instability, rotator cuff injuries, pectoralis tears, etc.

The fellow rotates with Dr. Lin 1 day/week for 6 months, divided into 3 month blocks. The fellow is given 1 day/week for research, elective clinical time, or practicing surgical skills. Money and time is provided to the fellow to attend 2 outside educational courses on shoulder and elbow surgery, coding, or the business of medicine.
