Dean G. Sotereanos, MD, is a Neer Circle Member of the American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons and is Co-Director of the Shoulder and Elbow Fellowship. He is nationally recognized for his work on chronic ulnar nerve compression, elbow instability, heterotopic ossification, total elbow arthroplasty, distal biceps tendon reconstructions, etc. The University of Athens named him an Honorary Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery in recognition of all the fellows he has trained for the last 30 years. He runs a busy shoulder and elbow practice performing over 500 cases per year. Since 2009, he has repeatedly been named one of the Top Doctors in Pittsburgh by *Pittsburgh Magazine*.

The shoulder and elbow fellow receives a high-quality education through hands on training in the office and operating room, weekly conferences, anatomic dissections, and open and arthroscopic model and cadaveric skill laboratories. The fellow rotates with Dr. Sotereanos 3 days/week for 6 months in equally divided in 3 month blocks. The fellow is given 1 day/week for research, elective clinical time, or practicing surgical skills. Money and time is provided to the fellow to attend 2 outside educational courses on shoulder and elbow surgery, coding, or the business of medicine.
